The High School Building Reserve Levy

- Maintain excellence in academics and extra-curricular activities.
- Preventative maintenance on the old part of the high school roof.
- Replace or update technology wiring in the high school to keep up with the technological demands of a 21st century high school.
- Review and update technology infrastructure, hardware, and software as needed.
- Install electronic locks and surveillance cameras to better enhance building security and ensure the safety of our students and staff.
- Install, replace, or repair sidewalks, driveways, parking lots.
- Completely renovate the “home” side of the football field to replace unsafe bleachers, add restrooms and concession area at the football field, and provide for the safety and convenience of our fans and guests.
- Renovate and repair restrooms and storage at the track.



What Will the Levy Cost Taxpayers?

- **\$100,000 per year, for five years.**
- Adds **\$9.23 per year** to property taxes on a \$50,000 house.
- Adds **\$18.46 per year** to property taxes on a \$100,000 house.
- Adds **\$36.92 per year** to property taxes on a \$200,000 house.
